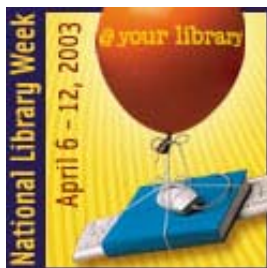


## National Library Week April 6-12

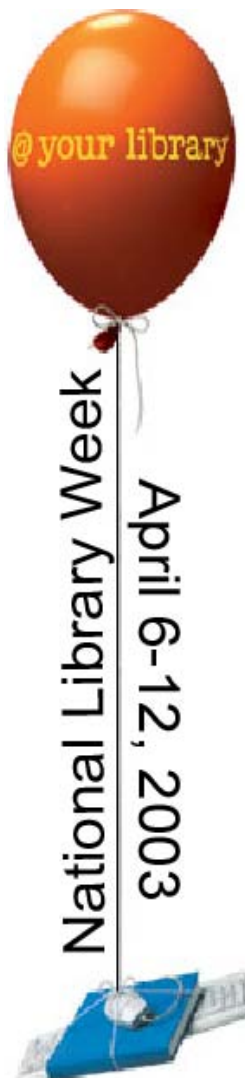
## Laptops for Road Warriors

Information Technology Services is pleased to announce the availability of laptops for road warriors. You can reserve a laptop through Scott Ekstrom (x3875), your travel computer expert, at Instructional Technology Service and Support located in the Foley Center Library.

When traveling, these small machines are designed to easily store in an overhead bin or under the seat in front of you. They are light enough so they are easy on the back and there is extra room in the carrying case for your papers or presentation material.

Most importantly, the laptops are designed to keep you in touch with colleagues on campus and loved ones back home. Each laptop comes with an Internet access account ready for use. When you call to reserve your machine, let us know where you will be traveling to and we will ensure that the local access numbers are ready to go. The computers also come equipped with the standard office productivity suite.

There is a \$10/day rental fee, chargeable to department accounts. This fee covers the cost of the laptops and the Internet access account. Please call ahead to reserve a machine so it will be prepped and ready for you when you pick it up.



## WWII Internment Camp Documents

Among the many small collections housed in Special Collections is one box relating to the Minidoka Relocation Center at Hunt, in south central Idaho. This facility was built to accommodate 9300 residents during World War II. Following the Army Western Defense Command's wartime order excluding American citizens and aliens of Japanese ancestry from the west coast, the War Relocation Authority was created to administer Minidoka and other centers for the temporary care of the displaced California, Oregon, and Washington evacuees. More than 13,000 people were inducted into and relocated from the Hunt project since August 1942, when the center was first occupied. It later became the 8<sup>th</sup> largest community in Idaho. The last resident departed the facility by the end of October 1945.

Victor McLaughlin was a program director of the facility. In 1989 McLaughlin's widow donated the materials to Gonzaga University. This small collection contains personal letters to McLaughlin from former residents, official documents from the War Relocation Authority, clippings, photographs, and other items. The most significant items are holdings from the camp's newspaper The Minidoka Irrigator from 1945.

Researchers and students from Gonzaga University and Whitworth College have used these materials. After studying the collection, students have a better understanding for what it was like for the camp residents to live in such a facility.

## Idaho State Law Library

After several months of setup and training, the Idaho State Law Library (ISLL) has gone live in Endeavor's Voyager Integrated Library System. ISLL made the move to Voyager on the afternoon of January 28, 2003 after making a clean break from their previous library automation software, Innovative Interfaces Incorporated.

Idaho State Law Library is the most recent addition to the Washington-Idaho Network, of which the Foley Center Library is a founding member. ISLL was established in 1869 under an Idaho territorial statute that included a \$500 appropriation for the purchase of law books. The library was housed in the Idaho Statehouse until it was moved to the new Supreme Court building in 1970. Its collection of 180,000 print, microfiche, and compact disc volumes contains both state and federal law, as well as legal periodicals, digests, citators, encyclopedias, and treatises of law.

In addition, the library is a selective depository for U.S. government publications. The library's materials are used by public officials, lawyers, students, the judiciary, and the general public. And while it is primarily a research library, as opposed to a lending library, members of the bar and state government employees may apply for borrowing privileges.

## Distance Library Services Tutorial in the Works

There is a new tool in the works for library outreach to distance learners. Up to now distance learners have benefited from live classroom instruction by library faculty (even at such far-flung and exotic locales as Nanaimo, British Columbia and Lethbridge, Alberta), video instruction, toll-free telephone calls, online instant messaging, web pages rife with helpful links, and reams of printed information to guide them through the challenges of off-campus research. Now they can add a dynamic PowerPoint-based tutorial to that list. The tutorial is a work in progress at this point, but the beginnings of it are available online at <http://prospero.gonzaga.edu/tutorial>. It is also available by request on CD-ROM.

Currently, the tutorial provides an overview of the Foley Center Library's homepage and an introduction to the Library Catalog's basic search interface. According to distance services librarian and the principal author of the tutorial, Jonathan Potter, future topics to be covered will include "how to find full-text journal articles online; how to search PubMed, MedLine, CINAHL, ERIC, SocAbs, PsycInfo, and other predominately *non*-full-text databases, how to obtain the full-text when it's not available online; how to use the interlibrary loan and article request web forms; how to get more information when you're finding too little of it, and how to pull the information diamonds out of the general mudslide when you're suffering from information overload. And much, much more."

## New Business Database @ Foley

Foley Center Library has a new business database, "Industry Norms and Key Business Ratios," provided by Dun & Bradstreet. Access is available through the Foley web site [www.foley.gonzaga.edu](http://www.foley.gonzaga.edu) under the "Business" section of the "Indexes and Databases" link. It is useful for students who want to analyze a business according to 14 key business ratios which fit into three major areas of business performance -- solvency, efficiency and profitability. The database arranges ratios according to industry categories using the Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) codes.

It also provides a 3 year analysis which makes it easy to compare a business' operating results with those of business competitors or the industry as a whole. In addition, students can select the ratios, years and asset ranges they want to analyze and display those in a spreadsheet format. They can also export the report and download it in Microsoft Excel. The library continues to receive the one year summary version of Key Business Ratios which is found in Reference at **HG 5681 . R25 I571** and has been published annually.
