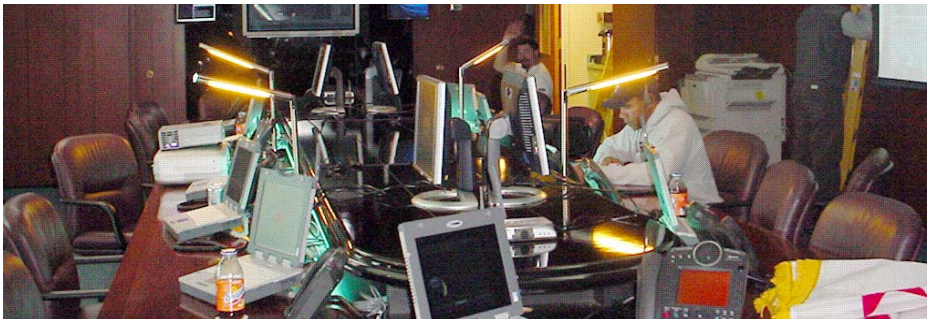

To film his newest movie, *End Game*, set to be released on September 9, 2005. *End Game* is a political thriller that details an investigation into the assassination of the US President. He left the National Hispanic University (NHU) in San Jose California for the “distinctive Gonzaga stamp.” At NHU Frederic Räuber had experience in Grant writing and administering; and he loved his students there. The only problem with his job as far as he could tell was that he didn’t get to spend nearly enough time working with students.

After meeting Eileen Bell-Garrison and Linda Pierce at a mid-winter conference he decided that he could really learn from them. He began his interview process shortly after hearing of the opening here at Gonzaga. For Frederic the deciding factor on whether to leave his current job boiled down to the students. He wanted to be sure that he would be coming to a group of students that would truly appreciate and benefit from his help.

Thus, he began to talk with random students that he ran into. He found that the students were very open and friendly. This made the decision easier for Frederic. He gave up the raise and housing allotment he was being offered by NHU so that he could come to Gonzaga to help the students in their researching needs. When I asked

Frederic how it was leaving all that he did he said, “Whenever I feel down about things, I remember the students. I missed all of them over the recent break.”

Frederic’s main goal for all students is to help them learn valuable skills for when they reach the “real world.” He has found the students to be very receptive of everything he is trying to teach them about the library, and even thirsting for the knowledge. The biggest surprise Frederic ran into was that students didn’t know what a librarian was there for, so he has found it a great experience to explain exactly why he is there, and how he can help.

I asked Frederic if he felt like the teachers on campus were as open to his teachings as the students and Frederic said that he doesn’t know; he judges how successful he has been by how many students come in to get help from him. The appointments have been coming faster than Frederic knows what to do with them.

On December 20, 2004, Foley Library turned on ‘ILLiad’, a new system for placing and tracking

Interlibrary Loan (ILL) requests. Since then over 750 members of the GU community have used the service submitting over 3800 requests and from what we’ve heard, people love it!

What makes ILLiad so “likable” are the services it provides to individual users. Once a person registers for ILLiad, they can place requests using only a username and password. They can also view the status of their requests, renew ILL books and pick up articles delivered electronically all through their ILLiad account.

On our end, we like the way it streamlines many of our routine tasks like sending e-mails to students when a book comes in and processing electronic deliveries for article requests. ILLiad also keeps great statistics providing us with information such as how many requests are filled each month, what journals are requested most often and which departments use ILL the most. If you haven’t used ILLiad yet, click on any of the ILLiad links on the Foley Homepage and then the link for “First Time Users”. We provide lots of information about interlibrary loan on those pages as well as the ILLiad registration form.
